
Q1 EOS reports: n= 1765

Top Three Event Types:

- Lab/Specimen
- Documentation/Communication
- Medication/Fluid

- ✓ Consistent with 2020 trends.
- ✓ No Serious Safety Events this quarter.







Laboratory/Specimen Data

- Consistently the highest volume of EOS submissions: the laboratory team does a FANTASTIC job documenting their actual and potential safety events and precursor conditions.
- In 2020, 20% of all lab EOS were related to mislabeled or unlabeled specimens. The laboratory leaders did a brilliant job drilling down on this data, identifying units and unit-specific issues so that units could evaluate and develop effective individualized solutions.
 - <u>Result</u>: In Q1 2021, mislabeled/unlabeled specimens have moved into second place and are now less than 12% of lab EOS submissions.

Bottom line: Less harm to kids. Fewer kids must have repeat venipuncture or other testing methods because their original samples were mishandled.









Communication: Scheduling & ADT events


Miscommunication with families is disruptive.

• Scheduling a patient for the wrong procedure has increased this quarter. When a parent has taken time off, taken their child out of school, driven to Omaha, secured overnight lodging, and had the visit/procedure approved by their insurance company ... and now they must go back to Step One to start over – this is a huge dissatisfier and not an infrequent occurrence.

The potential for adverse events or serious safety events is high in ADT transitions:

- Safety checks: allergy bands, bedside equipment, milk labeling
- Admission weights, COVID screening, incomplete handoff






Medication Dispensing
